

## Explore Edmonton

### Edmonton to Jasper

Start your journey through western Canada by taking the Yellowhead Highway from Edmonton to Jasper. This scenic trip is a refuge for the adventurous and a haven for those desiring to relax and soak up the scenery, nestled among the Canadian Rocky Mountains of Jasper National Park and within the Athabasca River Valley. The stunning Athabasca Falls, situated just south of Jasper on the popular Icefields Parkway, are a must-see. Bears, moose, elk, deer, caribou, bighorn sheep, mountain goats, and bears can all be seen.

### Jasper to Edmonton

If you return to Edmonton today, you can take in some of the city's attractions, such as a brewery tour or a visit to the West Edmonton Mall. If that's not your thing, go to the Old Strathcona Farmers Market, Edmonton's largest year-round indoor farmer's market, to stock up on your favourite foods. Consider taking an Edmonton Brewery Tour to sample the city's booming craft beer scene, which has the city's taste buds tingling. The West Edmonton Mall is the largest shopping mall in North America, with over 800 shops and facilities, as well as a waterpark and amusement park. If shopping is your thing, you'll almost certainly find what you're looking for here. Don't forget to bring a map with you.

### Edmonton to Elk Island National Park

Elk Island National Park is the destination for today's journey. Be on the lookout for elk, moose, white-tailed deer, and mule deer, as well as bison traffic jams. This provincial park serves as a vital bison refuge. Snuggle up for a starry night at Beaver Hills Dark Sky Preserve on clear evenings. Depending on the season, you may be treated to meteor showers or the enchanting northern lights. With over 80 kilometres of hiking trails, there are a variety of lengths and fitness levels to choose from. Steep inclines and large hills aren't a problem on these trails now that you're out of the mountains and into the prairies!

### Elk Island National Park to Edmonton

There's plenty to see and do in Edmonton, Alberta's capital city, from local bistros and boutiques to art galleries and hockey, Canada's favourite sport. Whyte Avenue in Old Strathcona is a lively, energetic neighbourhood in Edmonton. Whyte Avenue, with its boutiques, art galleries, and locally run restaurants, is a great place to spend some time soaking up Edmonton's unique vibe. The Art Gallery of Alberta houses masterpieces, and if you're a sports enthusiast, Edmonton is home to hockey legend Wayne Gretzky and the Edmonton Oilers. At Rogers Place, you can watch a game.
