This far north tour brings you the best of winter activities that the Great White North can offer - dog sledding, snowmobiling, snowshoeing, ice fishing, wildlife viewing, hot springs, flightseeing, and Aurora Borealis viewing. On our fun packed Winter tour program, you will travel like a musher, dine like a fisherman, track like a stamper, and explore like a native Yukoner.

On our spectacular sightseeing flight above the area surrounding Whitehorse, you'll have a chance to get a bird's eye view the grand landscape of the far north. Explore the rich history of the Yukon on our city tour; watch local wildlife up close at the Yukon Wildlife Preserve and relax in the soothing hot waters and sauna of the local hot springs. You will learn how to mush with your team of huskies as they whisk you away on trails in the winter wonderland. Feel the

rush of driving a snowmobile in the backcountry to magnificent viewpoints. Set out on a beautiful winter lake to discover the tranquility of ice fishing. If you are lucky with a good catch, your guide will fillet it and cook it on the fire for you. Set your tracks during a snowshoeing tour among some of the most impressive landscapes.

On three evenings of your choice, you'll travel just outside the city centre, but far enough from the city lights to an idyllic Northern Lights viewing location, the Aurora Centre. The evenings will feature relaxing Northern Lights viewing beside a cozy wood stove or roaring campfire. A winter vacation is truly complete with the chance to view the aurora borealis cascading across the night sky.

Note: This tour does not accept children below 19 years.

Day 1: Arrive in Whitehorse.

Arrive in Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport. Our representative will meet you on arrival and transfer you to hotel in downtown Whitehorse. Rest of the day free to explore Whitehorse on your own.

Overnight in Whitehorse, YT.

Day 2: Wildlife, Hot Springs, A Birds-Eye-View, and Northern Lights

Our day starts with a sightseeing flight above the spectacular winter scenery on a 30-minute sightseeing flight. On these sightseeing flights, you will be able to take in breathtaking scenes of Yukon's winter landscape from an angle only few people ever can. Back in Whitehorse you will go on a discovery tour of the history of Whitehorse and the of the Great White North. Whitehorse has a lot to offer and is home to famous sights like the historic 'Paddlewheeler SS Klondike or a "Skyscraper" completely made from logs. Later we will drive to the Yukon Wildlife Preserve where you will see up close inhabitant game like the Elk, Moose, Caribou, Mountain Goats and Lynx in their natural surrounding. Not far from here we will visit the Eclipse Nordic Hot Springs where you can indulge yourself in the natural hot waters and relax in a breathtaking winter mountain setting.

Later that evening you'll be back on the road again to seek views of the stunning Northern Lights. Relax in sheltered comfort, or under the starry sky beside a warm fire at one of our tailor-made Aurora viewing locations.

Day 3 – Huskies, frozen Winter Trails, and Northern Lights

Today you will get to learn the old tradition of mushing (dog sledding). Post a detailed safety briefing you will get introduced to the art of dog sledding and soon you will be on your way along the frozen

winter trails. Feel the power and endurance of the dogs, listen to their breaths, and feel the creaking snow under the runners. This is a unique experience!

Back in Whitehorse from the dog sledding trip, reward yourself with a beer from the famous Yukon Brewery at one of the downtown restaurants.

Later in the evening we set out to the Aurora Centre where we'll seek the sight of northern lights.

Day 4 – Snowmobiles, Frozen Trails

This morning, we drive into the mountains close to Whitehorse. After a detailed safety introduction, we step on our snowmobiles. At an enjoyable speed, you will pass through the memorable winter scenery of the Yukon and soak up the view of snow-covered mountains and lakes with thick layers of ice. Your snowmobile journey will be an exhilarating ride up and down magnificent mountains or a relaxing tour through the forest and down historic trails.

Tonight, is another chance to see the Aurora Borealis as we set out to the Aurora Centre.

Day 5 – Go Fishing on a Frozen Lake

Today, we go Ice Fishing. We will head out on an Ice Fishing Adventure on one of the beautiful lakes in the Whitehorse area. We will use an ice-auger to drill a hole in the ice which could be between 30 cm to one-meter-thick! Hot drinks will be available to keep everyone warm and toasty. Look around and enjoy the beauty of a winter's day while waiting for the big catch! If you are lucky enough to catch a nice trout, our guide will fillet it and cook it on the fire for you.

At the end of our day, we return to Whitehorse with a record catch of great memories.

Day 6 – Set your tracks in this Winter Wonderland

One of the best ways to enjoy the tranquility of the Yukon wilderness and to photograph the stunning Yukon landscape is Snowshoeing. On our half day snowshoeing tour, you'll get to strap on a pair of lightweight modern snowshoes and experience the rugged backcountry just like the gold miners, trappers and fur traders of days gone by did. Tour visits a scenic location in the Whitehorse area backcountry. Wildlife such as spruce grouse, foxes, coyotes, and snowshoe hares are occasionally spotted at a distance.

- **Skill Level** – What kind of Skill Levels are required to participate in this tour? – This is a **Beginner Level Skill Tour**. You are provided necessary briefing on each day of the tour so you can participate safely if you follow the guide and the guidelines and briefings provided by the operator/guide.
- **Is this tour an Escorted Tour with a Tour Director?** No. This is not an Escorted Tour with a Tour Director. Some services offered on an escorted tour such as check-in assistance by a dedicated Tour Director, etc. are therefore not offered in our Northern Lights Tours. Commentary on sightseeing tours will be either a pre-recorded commentary or narrated by your driver-guide in English.
- **Will there be other people on this tour?** Yes. This a shared experience. There will be other clients on this tour.
- **Will I be sitting with the same group of people on this tour like on a Escorted Tour?** No. The participants one ach of the tour may vary.
- **What size of coaches are used for transfers and tours?** We use 56-, 33- and 24-seater coaches for our tours and transfers. For smaller number of clients, the operator reseves the right to use smaller vehicles such as mini vans, suvs, 10-seaters, etc.
- **What is the minimum age to participate in this tour?** - 19 years. Children under 19 are not accepted.
- **Will there be other persons on this tour?** Yes. This is a shared experience. There will be other persons on this tour.
- **Will I be sitting with the same group of people on this tour like on a Escorted Tour?** No. The participants one ach of the tour may vary.
- **What size of coaches are used for transfers and tours?** Typically we use 56-, 33- and 24-seater coaches for our tours and transfers. For smaller number of clients, sometimes smaller vehicles such as 14-, 12- and 10-seater vehicles may also be used.
- **Would there be last minute changes to the itinerary?** - Due to the nature of this tour last-minute changes to the itinerary are a possibility and are left up to the discretion of the guide.
- **Arrival Transfers - are Airport Transfers available for us 24 hours/7** – No. The Airport transfer services is offered daily only from 4 AM to 8 PM. Outside these hours you are required to make your own arrangements for transfers from and to Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport (YXY). There is a Taxi Kiosk outside the Departure Doors. You can also phone one of the many local taxi agencies to arrange transportation. Yukon Cabs services Whitehorse Airport and you can call them at (867) 333-4444.
- **Departure Transfers – are transfers offered 24/7** – No. The departure transfers are offered only 4 AM to 8 PM. Outside these hours you are required to make your own arrangements for transfers from and to Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport (YXY). If you are departure is outside these hours, we recommend you call Yukon Cabs at (867) 333-4444 book your cab ride to the airport at least 48 hours ahead.
- **Who provides departure transfers** - Airport departure transfers might be operated by a third-party taxi service with an English-speaking driver? Taxi services are pre-booked, and guest will receive a voucher as full payment for the taxi service.

- **What kind of information should I provide to book this tour?** – We need the below information for us to book you on this tour
 - Full names (first, middle, last)
 - Tour name
 - Date, activity, and type
 - Airline arrival information
 - Weight (if travel arrangements include small aircraft)
- **Do we have to sign a Waiver to join this tour?** – Yes. You will be required to sign a waiver to join this tour. The operator will provide you the Waiver before start of the tour. Minors under 19 – parents/guardians are required to sign off on the Waiver.
- **Wi-Fi Signal - How's the signal?** - 4G smartphone cell coverage is available in all communities, but not in between. Check with your cell service provider to find out if your phone will work here. Satellite phone networks are accessible across the Yukon and satellite phones can be rented in Whitehorse.
- **Is the Yukon always chilly?** - Temperature in the Yukon fluctuates, but warm and sunny weather in Summer (mid-May to September) with temperatures often in the 20s (°C) is not uncommon. Daylight hours are longer, too. In some areas the midnight sun shines all night long. Winters can be chilly (as you may have heard), but dress appropriately and you'll hardly even notice.
- **Are there bears in the Yukon?** – Yes. The Yukon is home to healthy populations of grizzly and black bears. We suggest that you read our wilderness travel tips.
- **Where is the best place to see aurora? And what time is best?** - To see aurora, you need clear and dark sky. During very large auroral events, the aurora may be seen throughout the US and Europe, but these events are rare. During an extreme event in 1958, aurora was reported to be seen from Mexico City. During average activity levels, auroral displays will be overhead at high northern or southern latitudes. Places like Whitehorse, Yukon; Yellowknife, NWT; Gillam, Manitoba; the southern tip of Greenland; Reykjavik, Iceland; Tromsø, Norway; and the northern coast of Siberia all offer a good chance to view the aurora overhead. In North Dakota, Michigan, Quebec, and central Scandinavia, you might be able to see aurora on the northern horizon when activity picks up a little. In the southern hemisphere the aurora must be active before it can be seen from places other than Antarctica. Hobart, Tasmania, and the southern tip of New Zealand have about the same chance of seeing aurora as Vancouver, BC, South Dakota, Michigan, Scotland, or St. Petersburg. Fairly strong auroral activity is required for aurora viewing in those locations.
- **What is the best time to see Aurora Borealis?** - The best time to watch for aurora is around midnight, but aurora occurs throughout the night. There are very few places on Earth where one can see aurora during the day.

Since clear sky and darkness are essential to see aurora, the best time is dictated by the weather, and by the sunrise and sunset times. The moon is also very bright and should be considered when deciding on a period to travel for the purpose of auroral observation. You might see aurora from

dusk to dawn throughout the night. The chances are higher for the three or four hours around midnight.

- **Is Aurora Borealis viewing best with a moon or no moon?** - We like moonlight because it lights up the foreground and makes the sky a deep blue instead of pitch-black like with no moon. We watch the lunar phase very carefully to allow for best light compositions for photography.
- **What is the best month for Aurora Borealis Viewing?** - In northern regions like the Yukon, the best time to view the aurora is from late August to mid-April. During the summer months the night skies are not dark enough to see the aurora borealis even at times when the solar wind activity is strong. In midwinter the temperatures may fall to the minus 40-degree range, and it is important to wear appropriate winter clothing (please see "winter clothing packages") to enjoy the displays.
- **How to photograph the Northern Lights?** - For starters set the camera on a tripod, adjust the ISO setting up to 800 or 1600, set the f-stop wide open (lowest number like f2.8) and start bracketing the exposure times. Try 5 seconds, 10 seconds, and 20 seconds. If the picture is still black and underexposed, then try 30 seconds and keep raising the ISO until something shows up on your LCD monitor.
- **Can I take Aurora photos with a cellphone?** - Basically, it is very difficult to take night photos with a cellphone. To capture the Northern lights, you will need to position your camera on a tripod to make sure you don't have any motion while you take a photo. We recommend you bring a camera which has a manual mode, which most medium-priced cameras have nowadays.
- **How long do the northern lights last?** - Anywhere from 10 minutes to all night long, depending on the magnitude of the incoming solar wind. "Coronal holes" consistently produce nice auroras, but big solar flares and CMEs-coronal mass ejections are responsible for global-wide aurora displays...the BIG shows!
- **Are there any rental camera services?** - We do not offer any rental cameras, but we offer a photo service and rental tripod. If you do not want to bring big camera, our Aurora guides will take your photo with northern lights, and you can choose to purchase it if you like it.
- **Does it have to be COLD to see the northern lights?** - No! It is a myth that the northern lights happen only when it's cold. They happen year-round and since there is more darkness to see them in the winter people associate the cold winter with the auroras. August and September are a great time to see the Aurora while wearing a T-shirt and shorts!
- **Winter Clothing - Should I wear rental winter gear for every tour?** - It is not mandatory, but we recommend it. December to April, the temperature drops to around -20 to -25°C, so our winter gear helps you to enjoy any tour comfortably and safe. We strongly recommend wearing our rental winter gear during snow shoeing, ice fishing, and Aurora Viewing tours.
- **What is a famous food in Whitehorse?** - Many restaurants serve local food like Arctic Char which comes from the arctic area. Also, meats like bison and reindeer are served as part of traditional meals. In the very far north you can also expect to taste traditional indigenous meals.
- **What time should I arrive to Whitehorse?** - If you are planning to join the Aurora Viewing Tour, we recommend arriving at the Whitehorse Airport before 8pm, then you have enough time to prepare for the tour.

- **How do we get to Whitehorse, YT?** - There are many ways to get to the Yukon, but flying is the easiest. You can catch regular flights with Air North, Yukon's Airline, from Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Ottawa, Kelowna, Victoria and Yellowknife. Or, if you're coming from further abroad, there are a variety of convenient flights arriving in the Yukon via other major airlines such as Air Canada, WestJet, and Condor. After you've fastened your seatbelt, it's time to share a few stories with your neighbour and one of Air North's famous warm cookies.
- **Will I see wildlife on these tours? - Yes.** There is a chance of seeing wildlife on the tour and we often spot animals, however we do not guarantee seeing wildlife on any of our tours. Our guides have a lot of knowledge about the animals within the park and can fill you in about them if you see any wildlife or if you have any questions.
- **Wild Animals – Is it safe to approach wild animals? Is it safe to touch them if they behave friendly?** **ABSOLUTELY NO.** Neither should you get out of your vehicle to photograph them even if they seem to be calm and even friendly.
- **Would I need a credit card to check-in at confirmed hotels, lodges, and inns?** Yes. Clients are required to present a Credit Card in their name at check-in. Hotel will typically take an authorization on the credit card for between \$500 and \$750 per stay to cover room incidentals and any damage to property. The authorization will auto-cancel within 72 hours of check-out less any incidentals or other charges relating to the room.
- **Is this tour customizable?** Absolutely yes. This tour is fully customizable. Additional costs may apply depending on how much customization is required.
- **What is your policy should our flight be cancelled and therefore we are unable to join the tour?** DMCi Inc. is responsible only for services booked through us. Therefore, your inability to travel or join the tour on time due any reasons including but not limited to delayed/cancelled flights, denied boarding, delayed/cancelled visas, health conditions, death in the family, etc. are not reasons for a refund or a substitution tour.
