

FAQ

- **How do I get to Mont Tremblant** – You can drive to Mont Tremblant from Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal, Quebec City and Boston.
- **How do we get to Mont Tremblant by Air** - Only 65 minutes from Toronto. For all your business or leisure needs, Porter offers direct flights from Toronto’s Billy Bishop Airport (YTZ) to Mont-Tremblant International Airport (YTM), plus connections to Ottawa, Sudbury, Windsor, Thunder Bay, Sault Ste. Marie and many more destination.
- **Montreal-Trudeau International Airport** - At only 90 minutes away from Tremblant, the Montreal-Trudeau International airport (YUL) is the most important airport in Quebec. Enjoy our ground transportation services between the airport and Tremblant Resort.
- **Arrival and departure transfers to and from Mont Tremblant** – We offer private arrival and departure transfers from Montreal and Ottawa to Mont Tremblant.
- **Transfers to and from VIA Rail Station** – Transfers to and from VIA Rail Station is not included. Metered cabs are available outside any of the VIA Rail Station. All the VIA Rail Stations are serviced by ride shares such as UBER and Lyft. Typical cab ride will cost between \$25 and \$30 plus gratuities. Seating is limited to three seats in the back. Trunk can accommodate one standard and one small suitcase per cab.
- **Can beginners ski at Mont Tremblant** - You can ski safely throughout the entire ski resort on very easy and easy slopes. There is a practice slope with moving carpets directly at the base station in the village. The local ski school offers a wide range of ski lessons.
- **Is Mont Tremblant hard to ski?** - The ski resort of Tremblant has runs of all difficulty levels. The slopes lead down to the valleys through long and sometimes wide forest glades. For experts, there are long mogul slopes and very difficult runs. Beginners will feel very comfortable on the flat, long and wide slopes.
- **What is skiing like at Mont Tremblant?** - Terrain. Mont Tremblant Resort covers over 755 skiable acres, including 178 acres of glades, and has a great mix of beginner to advanced terrain. The resort receives an abundance of snowfall (156 inches) and is complimented by one of the largest snowmaking systems in North America, which covers 465 acres.
- **Do they speak English at Mont Tremblant?** - While the primary language in Mont Tremblant is French, locals will often speak English to those non-French speaking tourists.
- **How many days do you need in Mont Tremblant?** - 4 to 5 days. People travelling to Tremblant should consider staying at least 4-5 days minimum to really experience what the resort has to offer. For the adventure-seekers, Acrobranche was definitely a great experience.
- **How long is a run at Mont Tremblant?**
 - Base elevation 230 m (755 ft)
 - Skiable area 2.53 km² (630 acres)
 - Runs 102 (total) (easy): 22 (difficult): 34 (more difficult): 42 (extreme): 15

- **How many lifts does Mont Tremblant have?** - 14 Mont Tremblant ski lifts. With over 600 acres, Mont Tremblant ski resort offers the best skiing in all North America. In 1939, the mountain began operating their first chair lift. Today there are 14 Mont Tremblant ski lifts that can handle 27,230 skiers per hour.
- **Is Mont Tremblant good for skiing?** - Although compact, it has a well-planned layout that makes the best of the available terrain and offers enough to keep all standards of skiers and snowboarders entertained. Located in the Laurentian Mountains north-west of Montreal, Tremblant is the leading ski resort in eastern Canada.
- **Is parking free in Mont Tremblant?** - Parking is free and there is a shuttle service that goes back and forth from the Pedestrian Village. Free Parking Lots in Mont Tremblant - <https://officialmonttremblant.com/getting-around/parking-mont-tremblant/>.
- **Is Mont Tremblant good for families?** - Mont Tremblant is one of the most family-friendly ski resorts in Canada. With nearly one hundred runs we lay out our favorite activities in Mont Tremblant. Mont Tremblant Ski Resort is in the Laurentian mountains in Quebec. The resort is a premier winter destination in Canada.
- **How do you get around Mont Tremblant?** - Transportation in Tremblant offers as many options as there are mountain trails. More common modes of transportation include an extensive public transportation system that includes the Tremblant bus service, easy to hop on and hop off. There is also an abundance of taxis for hire and other rideshare services.
- **Where is Pedestrian Village in Mont Tremblant?** - Mont Tremblant Pedestrian Village is located at the foot of the Mountain in Mt Tremblant Canada. This Disney like ski village is divided into two sections, the upper area and lower area. From the upper area skiers can access the top of the mountain by riding the open lift-style gondola.
- **Are there Ubers in Mont Tremblant?** - There are taxis, but no Uber/Lift. The community bus is free, that might work for you, it does go to the resort, and can carry gear. Your best option would be the bus, to rent a car or stay closer to the resort.
- **Ottawa - 2-hour Historical Highlights Walking Tour** – This tour departs from 90 Wellington Street (the Terry Fox statue at 90 Wellington Street).
- **Montreal – Old Montreal Walking Tour** - Meet at the southwest corner of Place d'Armes (Intersection of Notre-Dame W. and Place d'Armes).
- **Montreal – Full day tour to Quebec City** - Hotel Pick up is available at downtown hotels only. Whether your package includes hotel pickup depends on the hotel where your stay is eventually confirmed. If hotel pick up is offered, the pickup will start 90 minutes before start of tour. Should hotel pickup be not offered, clients are required to report to tour start point at 1255 Peel Street, Montreal, Quebec H3B 4V4. Clients must go inside and present their Voucher at the Gray Line Ticket Counter located inside the Information Center and exchange same for tour tickets.
- **Would the client require a credit card to check-in** at confirmed hotels, lodges, and inns? Yes. Clients are required to present a Credit Card in their name at check-in. Hotel will typically take an authorization on the credit card for between \$500 and \$750 per stay to cover room incidentals and any damage to property. The authorization will auto-cancel within 72 hours of check-out less any incidentals or other charges relating to the room.
